

U.S. Planning To Withdraw 1,700 Men From Dominican Republic

WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States announced today that it will send about 1,700 troops from the Dominican Republic to the United States.

About 2,000 American Marines and paratroopers are in the anti-aircraft Caribbean country, the first of their kind to be sent in April 1965.

The country has said that it would pay the cost of the troops, but the United States has refused to accept the offer.

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At the opening of the OAS special conference called to discuss what to do about the Dominican Republic, the United States announced that it would withdraw 1,700 troops from the Dominican Republic.
